Sermons for the Month of July



July is a five Sunday month, and you may remember the tease in our late June newsletter included two Sunday's lessons and sermons. Now July is here,

and here is a reminder of those first two Sunday's plus information on the remaining three. The first Sunday is July 3rd and a communion Sunday. We will also celebrate Betty Robinson's 90th birthday to come on the 4th. The lessons for that Sunday are 2 Kings 5:1-14 and Luke 10:1-11, 16-20 which examine The Peace That Comes to You. On the 10th, the scriptures we will examine are Amos 7:7-17 and Colossians 1:1-14 which speak of Changing Kingdoms. We will also ordain and install our new officers during that service. The third Sunday in July, the 17th, the scripture readings are Amos 8:1-12 and Luke 10:38-42 which deal with Hearing the Word. The month begins to wind down on the 24th, as we will examine the texts of Colossians 2:6-15 and Luke 11:1-13 and consider Prayer. The last day of the month is a Sunday, July 31st, and in Hosea 11:1-11 and Colossians 3:1-11 which stress our faith location and urge, Don't Go Back. Every month is a fitting month to gather to hear the Word of God, and while we have that freedom, let us make full use of it.

The Session met for its regular meeting on June 21, 2016.

New business

At the Congregational meeting four people were

elected to the Nominating Committee for fiscal year 2017. They were David Byers, Zana Byers, Eleanor Garvey and Mike Ragan. The Session elected Lora Savoie and Deb Lowrance to serve on the committee as the representatives from Session.

The Ordination and Service for the Class of 2018 was rescheduled to July 10th during worship.

Standing Committee reports

It was noted that the regularly scheduled June 5th communion had been cancelled.

Jerry Ragan reported that the construction superintendent for the new building south of the church continues to be a good neighbor. He has removed some rocks and stumps along the property line. He plans to do further cleanup including removing unwanted trees and trimming of bushes upon completion of the building. Jerry has replaced old wiring and lighting in the area of the stairs to the basement which makes it safer for those who go there for supplies.

The regular potluck will be on June 26th, according to June Ragan. She also advised that on July 3rd, after worship, there will be a celebration of Betty Robinson's 90th birthday. Cake and punch will be served.

Eleanor Garvey reported for the MemberCare committee advising that she had sent cards to ten members who have not been able to attend worship recently. She advised that the committee prepared a reception of cookies and lemonade following the memorial service for Janet Mackey. A prayer shawl was given to Reagan Mackey.

The Session gave thanks to Eleanor Garvey, Zana Byers and June Ragan, who are rotating off Session, for their service on Session.



News from Jory Bayne



Becky's Music Notes July 2016





Psalm 95: "O come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation! Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!"

There are several Psalms in the Bible that refer to "making a joyful noise"; Psalm 96; Psalm 98; Psalm 100; just to name a few. Music has been a part of my life since I can remember. My mother was a piano major and taught piano lessons in the home for many years. She was also organist for different churches in Cedar Rapids, where I grew up. My father took piano lessons as a child; I remember him and Mom playing duets periodically on the piano. When the

organist job, at Highland, came open in 1990, I talked with Mom about it. I had not touched a keyboard in 10-12 years and was not sure if I could even play. With Mom's encouragement, I decided to give it a try. I took organ lessons from Larry Marta at TJC in April and May 1990. I was officially hired during the summer of 1990 as Highland's Organist. I continued to take lessons from Larry for several years and even took a few music classes.

Growing up my parents were at band, orchestra & choir concerts, football games, piano recitals, operas and church to listen to their children play and or sing. All four of their children were involved in music in one way or another growing up. My oldest brother, Mark, played saxophone and cello. My brother, Dave, played trombone. He marched in the Iowa State Band when he was in college. My sister, Sharon, played piano, violin and sang; her major in college was music, specializing in Opera. She still plays violin, viola and piano, and teaches all three. She has been in the chorus at the Lyric Opera in Chicago for about 25 years. I grew up playing piano, flute, and actually took a year of harp lessons in junior high. And, believe it or not, I took a summer of organ lessons from my mother when I was in high school.

When Mom and Dad moved to Tyler in 1993, Mom and I decided to try playing piano/organ duets, again. The first time we ever played together I was in high school and it was "The Palms" (your welcome, Sara). And we have since added several pieces to our "library". Music has ALWAYS been a big part of my life and has continued to be as John and I got married and had children. Ask Katy or Chrissy about music at our house or in the cars, they will tell you, music was on most of the time. Of course, what we listen to at home ranges from country, to rock, to blue grass, to jazz. When the girls were little, there was a little "Veggie Tales" thrown in as well. That was and is our "joyful noise" at home.

The View from the Back Page

As Reagan and I continue to get used to life without Janet and discover all the ways we have to re-order our lives while dealing with the initial numbing and confusion of grief, I find casual concentration difficult to maintain. So for this month's back page article, I'm just going to scatter shoot some topics.

The Presbyterian Church U.S.A. General Assembly met the last two weeks of June. While controversy was generally missing, also missing was anything which might point toward a greater support for the actual field of missions in a denomination - the local churches. In addition, the lack of controversy was also a result of a kind of homogenization of language. If you can empty words of their most specific meanings and contexts, then the bland simplicity of "See Spot. See Spot run. Run, Spot, run!" literalism takes their place. What should have been scandalous is passed off as over-thinking and misusing words and misunderstanding the heart. (If you want details, you can ask me about it when you have a few minutes.)

A pastor's conference in August asks an interesting question in one of the proposed sessions - "Who Moved? Something Has Changed Between the Church and the Culture." The answer is probably less sexy, since both the Church and the Culture have moved. Which moved the most, and whose movement most effected the other is difficult to assess. We notice the effects - a coarsened culture with almost shameless crudity and a confused Church that lacks confidence. It might be interesting to find out what responses they feel might be required.

Enjoy your vacations, and remember prayer can and should be done anywhere and everywhere!
